

# Rebuilding year for Cyclone fall sports teams

HARLAN -- There was an unfamiliar feeling on the fields, courts and terrain of Harlan Community High School these past few months.

There were no football playoff games for just the second time in the last 22 years, but also the second time in the last three... no state tournament run to Cedar Rapids for the Cyclone volleyball team (snapping a five-year streak) and no team qualifiers for the State Cross Country Meet for the first time since 2003.

Through it all, the sun still rose in the east during late October and early November mornings.

While 2016 was definitely a "down" year for the Cyclones' fall sports teams, it was also a rebuilding year as many young student-athletes were forced into varsity action for the first

The fall wasn't without its bright spots, either. Greichaly Kaster made sure that HCHS was at least represented in state competition when she qualified for and competed at her second State Cross Country Meet. Nick Foss spearheaded a potent offense in football as the Cyclones finished 4-5 overall. In volleyball, HCHS battled a brutally-challenging schedule with many newcomers and still managed to fashion a winning record of 20-18.

The following pages will take a look back at each Cyclone fall sport, featuring final statistics, school records, postseason honors and more. Season summaries and a list of academic honors are included on this page.

#### **FOOTBALL**

For the second time in the last three years, HCHS finished with a losing record on the gridiron and fell short of qualifying for the Class 3-A playoffs, tying for fourth place with a 3-4 District 7 mark.

The Cyclones could score on just about anybody, averaging 37.8 points per game, but struggled to get stops with a defense featuring 11 new starters and a new coordinator in John Murtaugh. Opponents averaged 38.6 points per game against HCHS, including a 70-49 defeat at Creston/O-M in which

the Cyclones set a school record for total yards (657) and still lost by three touchdowns.

The team did improve, however, losing by just eight points (49-41) to eventual Class 3-A semifinalist Glenwood in Week 4 and dropping a 35-32 heartbreaker to district champion Carroll two Fridays later.

The Cyclones also pulled off perhaps the largest comeback in program history, rallying from 27 points down and pitching a second-half shutout to win 35-34 at Denison-Schleswig.

Foss earned second-team All-State honors as a first-year starting tailback, leading the team in both rushing (1,164) and receiving (622) while scoring 25 total touchdowns. He broke Todd Nelson's singlegame rushing school record with 334 yards vs. Atlantic and tied a school record with six TDs on the same night.

First-year quarterback Deren Schmitz also had a solid season with 1,875 passing yards in just eight games. He threw 18 TDs compared to nine interceptions.

Schmitz and Foss will both be back in the mix next year along with three starting offensive linemen and sophomore defensive end Jake McLaughlin, who led the team in total tackles and tackles for loss despite not starting until midway through the season.

Following a 3-6 season in 2014, the Cyclones bounced back to go 8-2 in 2015. Come next fall, a similar type of turnaround can't and shouldn't be ruled out.

### **VOLLEYBALL**

On the heels of five straight trips to the state tournament and three consecutive appearances in the Class 4-A title game, the Cyclone volleyball team had its share of good moments in 2016 but couldn't retain its elite status with many varsity newcomers in the fold.

Rebuilding from the loss of back-to-back stellar senior classes that included the likes of Jess Schaben (now starring at Iowa State) and Taylor Frederick (playing basketball at South Dakota), HCHS finished 20-18 overall and went 6-4 in the Hawkeye Ten to place fifth.

The Cyclones won nearly all of the matches they were supposed to win but couldn't pull off any "big" victories against the likes of state qualifiers Lewis Central, Kuemper and St. Albert.

With about nine letter winners set to return next fall, this year's rugged schedule should pay dividends in the future. Of Harlan's 18 losses, only one came against an opponent that wasn't ranked either at the time they faced HCHS or at the end of the year. Eleven losses were incurred by eventual state qualifiers, including a 3-0 regional semifinal loss at Lewis Central.

Potential remains high for 2017, but the Cyclones will have to get the job done with a new head coach. Angie Spangenberg, who received the state's Golden Plaque of Distinction Award in November, resigned as volleyball coach following a tremendous sixyear run at HCHS.

The new coach will inherit a squad returning a solid senior group that includes this year's kill and block leader in Haley Leinen, the serving and digs leader in Sidney Craig and the assist leaders in Whitney Warner and Kara Weis, along with several other key performers.

#### **CROSS COUNTRY**

Doug Renkly's Cyclone cross country teams showed consistency in 2016 despite battling their share of illness and injuries, but too often that consistency found HCHS placing "middle of the pack" in the team standings.

For the first time in recent memory there were no varsity team titles claimed by either Cyclone squad. The girls placed fifth at the Hawkeye Ten Conference Meet and seventh at the 3-A State Qualifying Meet; the boys finished seventh and eighth, respectively.

Those results signaled the end of a 12-year streak that saw at least one Cyclone team qualify for the state meet. The girls had competed in Fort Dodge 11 of the last 12 years while the boys had qualified three straight times.

From an individual standpoint, sophomore Greichaly Kaster provided many of the 2016 Cyclone highlights, concluding with a top-half-of-thefield 64th-place finish at the state meet. Kaster placed in the top 10 of every meet prior to state, including a third-place Hawkeye Ten finish in which she broke her own five-kilometer girls' school record.

On the boys side, senior Reagan Hansen and junior Drew Voge were the team's top two runners. Hansen recorded five finishes in the top 11 and came in 28th at the state qualifier. Voge had seven top-30 finishes.

Looking ahead to next year, both HCHS squads have realistic expectations to improve with some hard work in the offseason. The Cyclone girls will return their top seven runners and the boys could bring back eight harriers who ran in at least one varsity race this fall.



### Hawkeye Ten All-Academic

A total of 17 Harlan Community student-athletes have been named to the 2016 Hawkeye Ten Conference All-Academic Sports Team for the fall season. The All-Academic list recognizes senior letter winners who have maintained a cumulative GPA of at least 3.50 during their high school career. HCHS junior Deren Schmitz passed for 1,875 yards in just eight games as a first-year starting quarterback.

### Foss: 2nd team All-State

Harlan Community junior running back Nick Foss was named to the Iowa Newspaper Association's Second Team All-State Offense in Class 3-A following an outstanding season in the Cyclone backfield. The 5-foot-10, 190-pound Foss totaled 2,217 all-purpose yards and also led the team with 25 total touchdowns. He was the Cyclones' leading rusher with 1,164 yards on 152 carries (7.7 ypc) and 18 TDs and the leading receiver as well with 622 yards on 24 catches (25.9) and six scores. Foss also averaged 26.9 yards on 16 kickoff returns, including a 92-yard touchdown runback against Lewis Central.

In the regular-season finale vs. Atlantic, Foss broke a 46-year-old school record by rushing for 334 yards on 23 carries and tied a school record by scoring six touchdowns in one game.

### Single-Game Yardage Record Falls; Foss sets one record, ties another

Harlan Community set two school records and tied another during a 4-5 season, breaking two program marks that had stood since 1970. In a 70-49 loss at Creston/O-M in Week 3, HCHS accumulated 657 yards of total offense, breaking the record of 629 set in 1970 against Jefferson.

In a Week 9 home game vs. Atlantic, Cyclone junior running back Nick Foss netted 334 rushing yards on just 23 carries, breaking the single-game mark of 304 yards set by Todd Nelson vs. Carroll in 1970. Foss also tied a school record by scoring six touchdowns that night, matching the accomplishments of Todd Hansen vs. Creston in 1988 and Ryan Fagan vs. Carroll in 1998.

HCHS came close to setting two other school records. Dillon Sears' 98-yard kickoff return TD against A-D-M was just one yard shy of Brian Kloewer's record and the team's 2,181 passing yards fell just 77 yards short of the nine-game school record set in 2011.





# **Coach Curt Bladt's Season Reflection**

The 2016 season saw six returning starters on offense and no returning starters on defense. With the graduation of Ethan Knudson, the kicking game also needed to be reworked.

The offense came together early and set a couple of all-time records - most team yards in a game and Nick Foss' 334 yards rushing in a single game, plus Nick's six touchdowns in a single game. We were able to move the ball both by the ground attack and the passing attack.

Season highlights would include overcoming a 34-7 deficit and scoring a fourth straight touchdown, plus the PAT, to secure a 35-34 victory at Denison. That carried over into the next week and a big win over rival Atlantic.

With many starters returning next fall, we look forward to improved play as the experience that we gained this year will be a launching pad for the 2017 season.

# Spangenberg receives Golden Plaque of Distinction Award

Harlan Community volleyball coach Angie Spangenberg was honored on November 11 as the 2016 volleyball recipient of the Iowa Girls' High School Athletic Union Golden Plaque of Distinction. She was presented her award plaque prior to the Class 4-A state title match at the US Cellular Center in Cedar Rapids.

The Golden Plaque of Distinction Award honors the Iowa coach who has demonstrated a successful career while making notable contributions toward school, community and the coaching profession. Spangenberg, who resigned the HCHS volleyball post following the 2016 season, has coached the sport for 24 years, compiling a record of 623-162-22.

She began her career at Red Oak, guiding the Tigers to nine state tournament appearances in 18 years, including state runner-up finishes in 1997 and 1998. Following a three-year coaching hiatus, Spangenberg coached HCHS the last six seasons, taking the Cyclones to state five times. They won back-to-back state championships in 2013 and 2014, followed by a state runner-up finish in 2015, and also claimed four Hawkeye Ten Conference titles. Spangenberg's record at HCHS is an impressive 198-43 (.822).

#### **More Honors:**

Spangenberg, who was also inducted into the KMA Sports Hall of Fame earlier this fall, is a three-time lowa Volleyball Coach of the Year and an eight-time District Coach of the Year. The American Volleyball Coaches Association honored Spangenberg as a National Coach of the Year in 2014 while the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS) named her as the State Volleyball Coach of the Year in 2015.

### **Assistant Coach of the Year: Swanson**

Harlan Community's Chad Swanson has been recognized as the Iowa Girls' Coaches Association Volleyball Assistant Coach of the Year for 2016. Swanson received a plaque commemorating the award at the November 19 IGCA Senior Volleyball Classic in Carroll.

Swanson has been a member of the HCHS volleyball coaching staff for nearly 20 years and also served one year as head coach in 2002. He has been involved with all eight of the program's state tournament appearances under head coaches Julie DuVal and Angie Spangenberg, including back-to-back state titles in 2013 and 2014.

Swanson is also the head boys golf coach at HCHS as well as a longtime assistant coach in boys basketball.

Swanson is the second straight Harlan Community staff member to receive the IGCA's Volleyball Assistant Coach of the Year honor after Carrie Schaben won the award in 2015.

### **All-Conference**

Led by first-team selection Sidney Craig, HCHS had four players named to this year's Hawkeye Ten All-Conference Volleyball squads. Craig, a junior, moved up from last year's second team while senior Brenda Hopkins received honorable mention for the second straight season.







### Kaster third at conference meet, improves school record, returns to state

Harlan Community sophomore Greichaly Kaster earned "all-conference" status for the second straight year by placing third at the Hawkeye Ten Conference Meet on October 13 at Iowa Western Community College in Council Bluffs. Kaster, who placed sixth at last year's H-10 Meet, was the lone Cyclone medalist on the day after finishing the five-kilometer course with a season-best time of 19:47 which also improved her 5K school record. Kaster established the girls' 5K record at 20:07 last fall and broke it twice this season, running 19:54 at the Lewis Central Invite before going seven seconds lower at the conference meet.

One week later, Kaster placed 10th at the 3-A State Qualifying Meet in Atlantic to qualify individually for the State Cross Country Championships at Lakeside Municipal Golf Course (Fort Dodge). In her second consecutive state meet appearance, Kaster placed 64th out of 140 runners in the Class 3-A girls field. She placed in the top 10 of every 2016 meet prior to state and finished in the top three on five occasions.




# Coach Doug Renkly's Season Reflection


