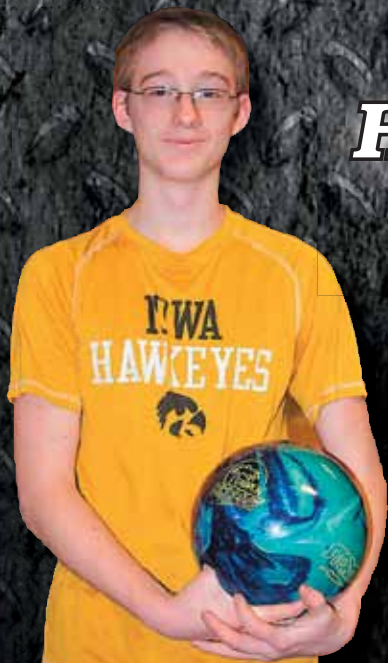

Foss state medal highlights HCHS winter sports

HARLAN -- The five varsity winter sports programs from Harlan Community High School combined to register an overall win-loss record of 52-41 during the 2017-2018 season.

There were ups and downs along the way, but for the most part the positives prevailed.

Senior wrestler Nick Foss provided the highlight of the winter months, earning a third-place medal at the State Wrestling Tournament in February for the Cyclones' highest finish in years.

Junior Oscar Olmos also qualified for state wrestling,

sophomore Darren Stein made the state bowling meet and senior Shane Chamberlain was a third team All-State selection in boys basketball, helping HCHS record 15 wins.

The following pages will take a look back at the winter season that was, providing full statistics, scores, photos, post-season honors and more. Academic awards are included on this page.

We'll start with a quick recap of each sport.

BOYS BASKETBALL

The Cyclones finished 15-8 overall - a four-win improve-

ment over last year's 11-11 - and tied for fifth place in the Hawkeye Ten Conference standings at 6-4. The team's eight losses included three against eventual Class 3A state champion Glenwood, two more vs. a talented Atlantic team and a buzzer-beater defeat at Denison.

Following an 11-2 start that began with six straight home games, HCHS struggled down the regular-season stretch by losing five out of seven, but turned things around in 3A substate play with home wins over Perry and Creston. The Cyclones hung right with Glenwood for three and a half quarters of a highly-entertaining substate final - their first in four years - before losing an 82-69 decision.

A senior-laden team, HCHS will graduate five of its top six scorers, led by Chamberlain and Logan Klaassen, who combined to score about 33 points per game while making 112 total 3-pointers.

The Cyclones outscored the opposition 66.7 to 59.3 during the season and finished plus four in rebounding margin compared to minus three a year ago. They also made 39 more threes than last season, raising their long-range percentage from .334 to .406 while also increasing their assist rate significantly.

GIRLS BASKETBALL

For the first time in Zach Klaassen's six years as head coach, the Cyclone girls finished with a sub-.500 record (9-12 overall) and exited in the first round of Class 4A regional play with a hard-fought loss to Glenwood. HCHS did notch a two-win improvement inside the Hawkeye Ten, however, going 6-4 to tie for fifth place.

Featuring a mix of youth and experience on the floor, the Cyclones hit their high-water mark in mid-January at 7-5 before losing seven of their

last nine outings, including three very narrow setbacks.

Senior Nicole Lange, a second team all-conference performer, led HCHS with 12.4 points and 6.6 rebounds per contest and was the only girl on the team to shoot better than 50 percent from the field (.526).

While the Cyclones played pretty good defense most nights - they were only outscored 50.9 to 48.3 on average - shooting struggles were often a culprit in defeat. HCHS shot 37.1 percent from the field, 26.6 percent from beyond the arc and 55 percent at the foul line.

WRESTLING

Team-wise, the Cyclone grapplers finished with a dual record of 16-11 overall and went 6-4 in the Hawkeye Ten (a one-win improvement) to earn fifth place. They also placed sixth at the conference tournament.

A 20-win season may have been within reach with a little luck at Mount Ayr's Ron Scott Memorial Dual Tournament in mid-January. HCHS lost two deadlocked dual scores by criteria and suffered another defeat by just three points.

From an individual standpoint, four Cyclones achieved 30-plus wins on the season. There were also two Hawkeye Ten champions for the first time in four years, four sectional champions and two state qualifiers.

Foss led the way at 195 pounds, going 42-2 to finish his career with 127 wins. He won his first H-10 championship and later went 5-1 in Des Moines to secure the program's highest state medal (3rd) since Brent Schumacher won a state title in 2002. Foss' only loss at state came on a somewhat controversial "slam" ruling and subsequent disqualification in the quarterfinal round.

Olmos (38-14) continued his

rapid improvement on the mats and finished his season at Wells Fargo Arena as well. Sophomore Ethan Lemon (35-13) won a Hawkeye Ten title at 120 and senior Daniel Soll finished 31-13.

BOYS BOWLING

For the third year in a row, the Cyclone boys bowling team tied a school record with eight dual wins and finished 8-3. They placed second at the Hawkeye Ten Conference Tournament to a very good Lewis Central team and also placed second at their 2A State Qualifying Tournament to host Shenandoah, narrowly missing a team state berth.

Harlan's balanced lineup featured four bowlers with game averages between 175 and 180, led by an eventual state qualifier in Stein (179.9). Stein's career-best 259 propelled him to an individual win at the state qualifier and an automatic berth to the state meet at Waterloo, where he finished 33rd out of 53 Class 1A bowlers. Stein is the Cyclone boys' third state qualifier in six years.

Senior Devin Wilson, meanwhile, rolled a 275 game at the conference meet and finished as the Hawkeye Ten runner-up.

GIRLS BOWLING

The Cyclone girls started the season with five straight dual defeats before improving in the second half of the year and finishing with a 4-7 record. Of their seven losses, three came by 100 total pins or less, including a 7-pin defeat vs. Nodaway Valley.

HCHS finished fourth at the Hawkeye Ten Conference Tournament and third at the 1A State Qualifying Meet with a lineup that usually included four seniors, one sophomore and a freshman.

Senior Makenzie Jones led the team with a 155.7 average and a fourth-place, two-game set of 363 at conference.

Hawkeye Ten All-Academic

A total of 16 Harlan Community student-athletes have been named to the 2017-2018 Hawkeye Ten Conference Winter Sports All-Academic Team. The HCHS girls and boys basketball teams, wrestling team, girls and boys bowling teams and the wrestling and basketball cheerleader squads have all been recognized for earning Team Academic Achievement Awards from the IGHSAU and IHSAA. Teams with a cumulative GPA of at least 3.25 were credited with a "Distinguished" Award while teams with a cumulative GPA between 3.00 and 3.24 received an "Excellence" Award.

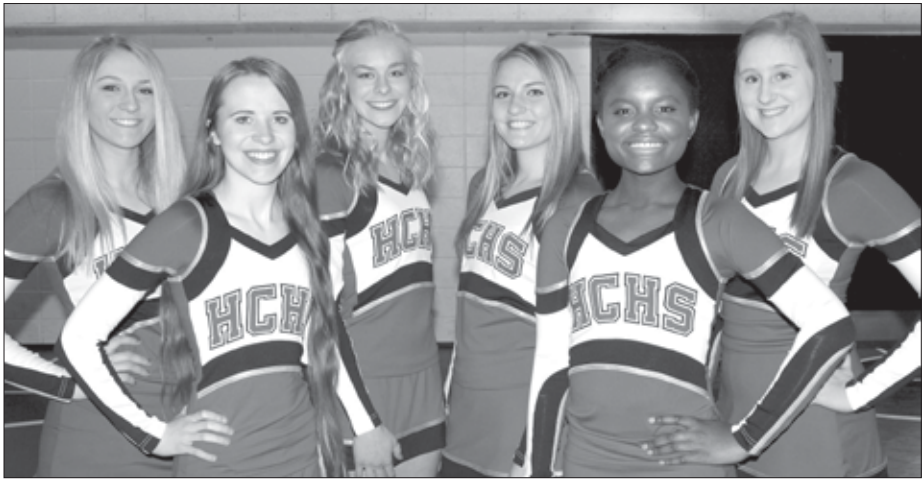

Head Coach Mitch Osborn’s
Season Reflection

The 2017-18 Cyclone boys basketball team finished the season with a 15-8 overall record and 6-4 mark in Hawkeye Ten Conference play. The Cyclones were district champions and played Glenwood in the substate final where they came up just short. HCHS started five seniors: Jared Moser, Shane Chamberlain, Jacob Hansen, Logan Klaassen and Deren Schmitz. Coming off the bench was senior Kevin Campbell Jr. and juniors Hunter Manz, Brett Sears and Jake McLaughlin. Sophomore Johnathan Monson also was a varsity letter winner this past year as he contributed at the varsity level along with senior reserve Drase Klindt.

I was very proud of this team as they competed hard all year. There were some peaks and valleys along the way, but we definitely peaked out right at tournament time, putting three very good games together. The H-10 Conference was extremely tough as the senior class was a very talented one league wide. We beat some very good teams along the way, including Abraham Lincoln, Lewis Central and Blair, and we also swept state tournament teams Kuemper and St. Albert. This team was one of our best three-point shooting teams as we finished 40.6 percent from behind the arc, knocking down 213 three-pointers.

Our junior varsity and 9th grade teams both had very good seasons and several of those guys will be competing for varsity playing time next season. We need to have a tremendous off-season this summer to put us in position to compete for a conference championship and a state tournament berth next season, which is our goal every year. We will lose 90 percent of our scoring to graduation, but I am very confident the group of young men we have coming back will step up to the challenge. I want to thank the senior class for everything they did to contribute to the Cyclone basketball program as they were a great group of young men.

Senior All-Star

HCHS senior Shane Chamberlain was selected to play in a pair of senior all-star games following the 2017-18 season.

Chamberlain scored a game-high 24 points in the KMAI and All-Star Classic held March 18 in Avoca, leading Team Howard to a 117-110 win over Team Harris. He added three rebounds and had one assist.

Chamberlain also played in the 42nd annual Iowa Boys Coaches Association All-Star Games on March 24 at Dallas Center-Grimes as a member of the Southwest Iowa team. He knocked down two 3-pointers in each game, scoring eight and 10 points, respectively. The SW Stars lost to the Northeast 109-97 and also came up short vs. the Northwest team, 120-114.

Chamberlain third team All-State

Harlan Community senior Shane Chamberlain was named to the Iowa Print Sports Writers Association's All-State list as a third-team selection in Class 3A after leading HCHS to a 15-8 overall record and a trip to the substate finals.

A versatile 6-foot-4 wing player, Chamberlain averaged a team-high 18.6 points per game, grabbed 6.1 rebounds per contest and led the squad with 37 steals and 58 made 3-pointers while adding 57 assists. He shot 41.4 percent from long range, 51.6 percent overall and knocked down 80-of-106 free throws (.755). Sixty-nine of his 140 total rebounds were offensive boards.

Chamberlain combined for 762 points, 291 rebounds, 71 steals and 102 treys during his junior and senior campaigns.

Stein qualifies for State Tournament

HCHS sophomore Darren Stein placed 33rd out of 53 individuals at the Class 1A Boys State Bowling Tournament held February 19 in Waterloo. Stein, the Cyclone boys' third state qualifier in the six-year history of the program, bowled games of 155 and 203 for a 358 series.

Stein qualified for state six days earlier by rolling a first-place set of 425 - including a personal-best game of 259 - at the Class 1A State Qualifying Tournament held in Shenandoah. He led HCHS with a game average of 179.9 on the season.

Hawkeye Ten Medalists

Led by boys' runner-up Devin Wilson, six HCHS bowlers secured individual medals by placing in the top 12 of the Hawkeye Ten Conference Tournament held February 9 at Thunderbowl in Council Bluffs.

Wilson, a senior, bowled games of 275 and 179 for a 454 series which earned him second place in the boys meet. Cyclone senior Bailey Schmitz placed ninth with a 400 (195-205) and senior Lucas Schmitz placed 12th with a 389 (249-140). Senior Keaton Jones narrowly missed a medal, rolling a 384 to place 13th. As a team, HCHS placed second out of seven schools.

On the girls side of the meet, Cyclone senior Makenzie Jones placed fourth with a 363 series (170-193), sophomore Jayden Gessert placed sixth with a 340 (161-179) and senior Emma Barnes earned the 12th-place medal with a 321 (138-183), edging out freshman teammate Abby Swank by eight pins. The HCHS girls finished fourth as a team.

Head Coach David Tyrrel's Season Reflection

The largest group of seniors ever was the theme for Harlan Community's sixth year of high school bowling. A lot of great performances from a lot of different bowlers really highlighted the year.

For the boys, five of the six varsity players were seniors, and any one of them could break out and be the star at any time. It was perhaps the most balanced team in school history, with the top four bowlers averaging within three pins of each other. Finishing the regular season at 8-3, including a second-place finish at the Hawkeye 10 Tournament behind Class 2A powerhouse Lewis Central, the boys looked ready to make their mark at the state qualifying tournament. A difficult lane condition that produced the lowest qualifying scores in the state awaited them, and in spite of their valiant effort they came up 59 pins short of host Shenandoah on its home court. One bright spot was that sophomore Darren Stein emerged the high qualifier, and for the third time in school history an individual boy qualified for state, finishing 33rd out of 53 at the state tournament.

The girls had an amazing second half of the year. Starting the season 0-5, this group showed a huge amount of heart. Behind top performers senior Makenzie Jones and sophomore Jayden Gessert, they kept getting better every week to finish the season at 4-7. Like the boys, they were in the hunt for a state qualifying spot all the way until the end, finishing just 77 pins behind eventual qualifier Tri-Center.

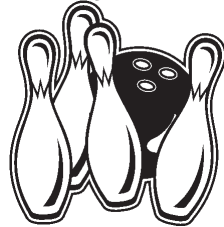

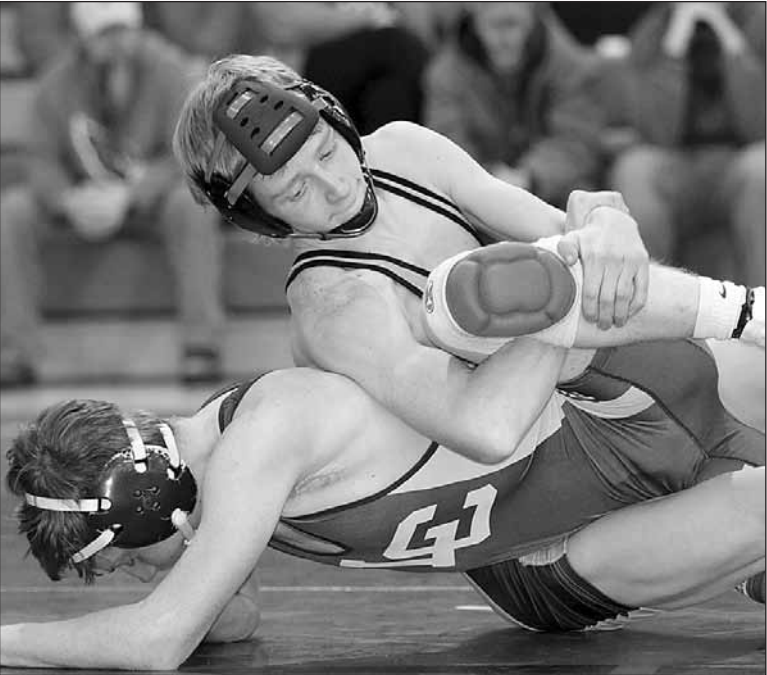

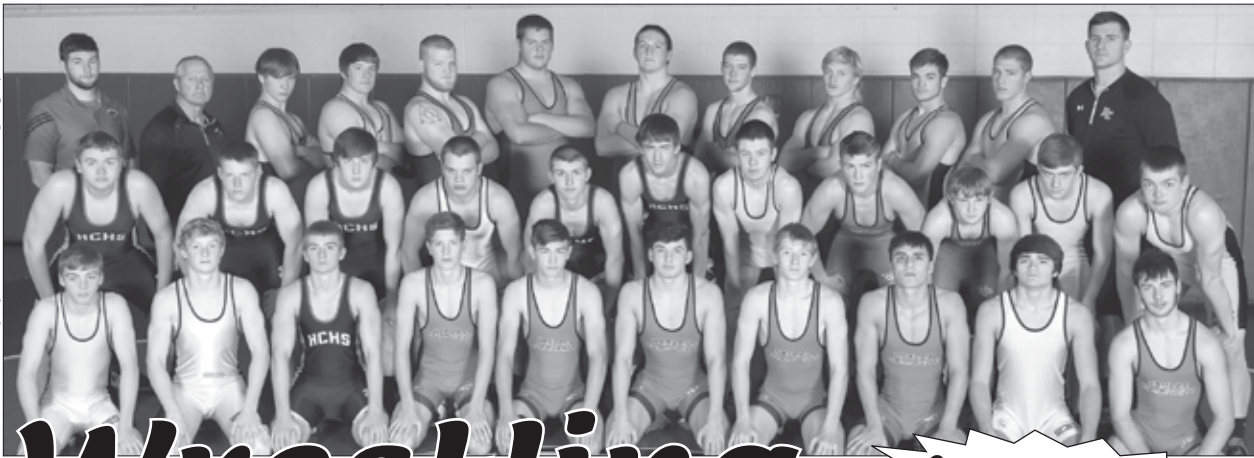
Foss surpasses 100 career wins

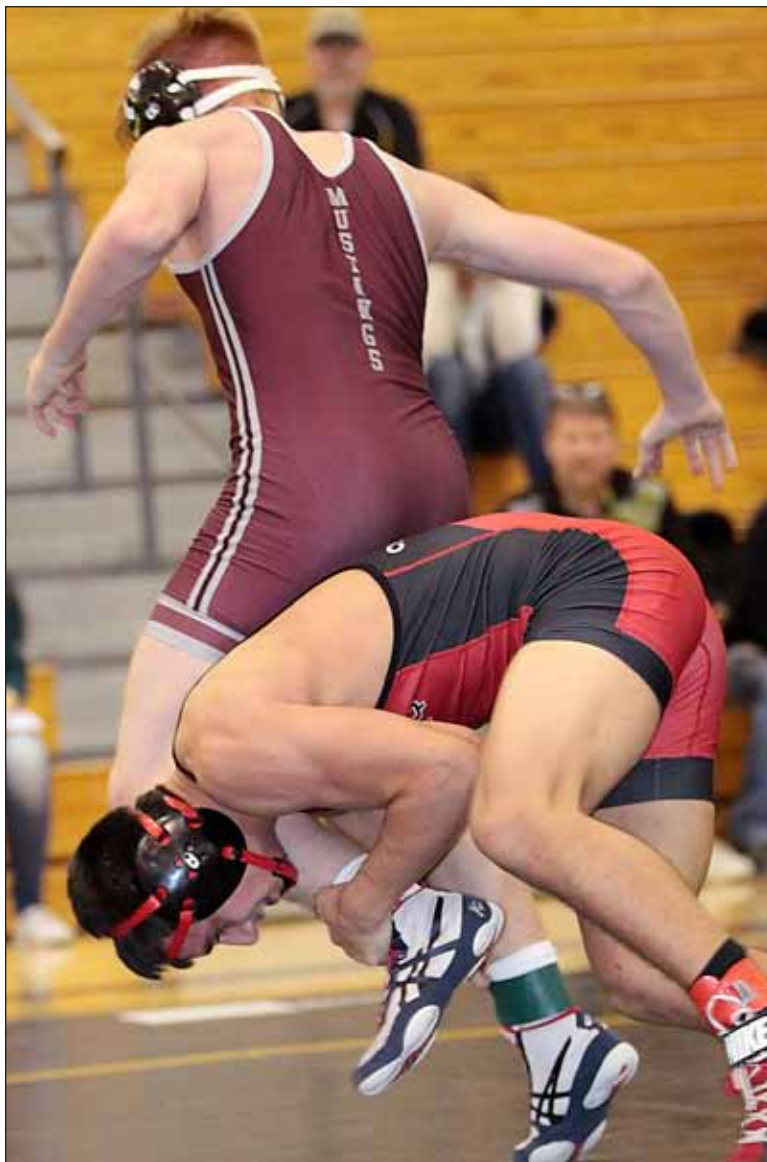
