




Harlan Fire Department history dates back to 1881

The Harlan Fire Department was formed Feb. 5, 1881, with it's first annual meeting. Initially, different companies were formed; the Engine Co. with O. Graves as foreman, the Hook and Ladder Co. with D. Chase in charge and O. Pearson in charge of the Hose Co. The department was called to its first fire June 18 of that same year, to a billiard hall on Market St., where minimal damage was caused by a lightning strike.

The first major expense of the Department occurred in 1885 with the purchase of a used Silsby Steam Pumper. It was acquired from Silsby Manufacturing at a cost of \$2,000. Meeting minutes reflect

the pumper was named after James M. Long, one of Harlan's pioneer citizens. Minutes also state, "it took place of the windmill, giving an almost inexhaustible supply of water and that it won't blow down as the windmill has in the past but it could blow up though they could not tell."

One of the biggest disasters the Department has



experienced was June 17, 1901, when Grant Norton lost his life in the line of duty. He was killed when a corncrib collapsed on him. The American flag is flown at half-mast on this disastrous day to remind us all of the dedication, danger and seriousness involved with being a firefighter.

The department has expanded from the single Steam pumper, which is still on display, to nine trucks in active service. The most recent additions are a 2012 Smeal pumper and a 2012 Danko tanker.

The one constant over the years is the pride of our department, which is clearly displayed in the meeting room's trophy case. On display are antique trophies dating back to 1883, to present-day awards. Our Department also shows great pride in owning and showing several antique fire trucks, including an 1878 Silsby Steam Pumper, a 1917 Ford Model T, a 1919 GMC, a 1928 Graham, and a 1935 Mack.

The Harlan Fire Department now hosts a 32-member roster, with each member completing challenging requirements to remain a firefighter. Our policy states that every individual must become a certified Firefighter within the first two years of joining the department. We are no longer a team of bucket brigades, but a family looking out for each other and their neighbors in times of disaster.



Fast Facts About File

Home fires

- Half of home fire deaths result from fires reported between 11 p.m. and 7 a.m. Only one in five home fires were reported during these hours.
- One-quarter of home fire deaths were caused by fires that started in the bedroom. Another quarter resulted from fires in the living room, family room or den.
- Three out of five home fire deaths happen from fires in homes with no smoke alarms or no working smoke alarms.
- In 2015, U.S. fire departments responded to an estimated 365,500 home structure fires. These fires caused 2,560 deaths, 11,075 civilian injuries, and \$7 billion in direct damage.
- On average, seven people die in U.S. home fires per day.
- Cooking equipment is the leading cause of home fire injuries, followed by heating equipment.
- Smoking materials are the leading cause of home fire deaths.
- · Most fatal fires kill one or two people..
- During 2010--2014, roughly, one of every 338 households reported a home fire per year.





Escape planning

- According to an NFPA survey, only onethird of Americans have both developed and practiced a home fire escape plan.
- Almost three-quarters of Americans do have an escape plan; however, less than half ever practiced it.
- One-third of survey respondents who made an estimate thought they would have at least 6 minutes before a fire in their home would become life threatening. The time available is often less. Only 8% said their first thought on hearing a smoke alarm would be to get out!

Smoke alarms

- Three out of five home fire deaths in 2010-2014 were caused by fires in homes with no smoke alarms or no working smoke alarms.
- Working smoke alarms cut the risk of dying in reported home fires in half.
- In fires considered large enough to activate the smoke alarm, hardwired alarms operated 94% of the time, while battery powered alarms operated 80% of the time.
- When smoke alarms fail to operate, it is usually because batteries are missing, disconnected, or dead.
- An ionization smoke alarm is generally more responsive to flaming fires and a photoelectric smoke alarm is generally more responsive to smoldering fires. For the best protection, or where extra time is needed to awaken or assist others, both types of alarms, or combination ionization and photoelectric alarms are recommended.
